Communication and Language

The development of children's spoken language underpins all seven areas of learning and development. Children's back-and-forth interactions from an early age form the foundations for language and cognitive development. The number and quality of the conversations they have with adults and peers throughout the day in a language-rich environment is crucial.

EYFS Framework 2021



Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Children's personal, social and emotional development (PSED) is crucial for children to lead healthy and happy lives, and is fundamental to their cognitive development. Underpinning their personal development are the important attachments that shape their social world.



Physical Development

Physical activity is vital in children's all-round development, enabling them to pursue happy, healthy and active lives.



Literacy

It is crucial for children to develop a life-long love of reading.

Writing involves transcription (spelling and handwriting) and composition (articulating ideas and structuring them in speech, before writing).



Mathematics

Developing a strong grounding in number is essential so that all children develop the necessary building blocks to excel mathematically.



Understanding the World

Understanding the world involves guiding children to make sense of their physical world and their community.



Expressive Arts and Design

The development of children's artistic and cultural awareness supports their imagination and creativity.



Religious Education

R.E. is taught in accordance with the Roman Catholic Diocese of Hexham and Newcastle agreed syllabus. This is called **COME and SEE** Religious Education Scheme. As a community we regularly celebrate Mass and the children prepare class liturgies and religious-based assemblies.

Catholic children in Year 4 celebrate the Sacraments of First Holy Communion and the Sacrament of Reconciliation.



To equip our children to take their role in today's society we ensure that all elements of our children's development are incorporated into our R.E. curriculum and school ethos. (Social Moral Spiritual and Cultural) We ensure that children have an awareness and appreciation of other world religions.

Parents have the right to withdraw their child from collective worship. However as parents have made a conscious decision to send their child to a Catholic Primary school, the Governors do not see parents wishing to take up this option.

Your Child's first Day

First Day @ SSPP, your child will need:

A named water bottle A spare set of clothing (nursery)

Due to limited space we ask that children not bring a bag into the school. Book bags can be purchased please see a member of staff. Nursery pupils will be provided with a book bag when they start using the Lending Library.

Evidence Me

We will continue to use the app, 'Evidence Me' to record and share the children's learning and a means of communicating with parents and carers.

As parents you will be connected to the app and will be able to see the observations being made in the setting. More importantly you will be able to add your own from home which is extremely valuable to us in learning more about your child.



How can you support your child at home?

- ★ Sharing books, talking about the pictures
- ★ Reading Book, make comments in their reading diary
- ★ Read/share books every night
- ★ Ongoing-encourage mark making, shopping lists etc.
- ★ Encourage children to talk.
- ★ Practise counting at any time-climbing the stairs, shopping etc
- ★ Play simple board games
- ★ Sing number rhymes and songs together
- ★ Listen to your child read every day a few minutes a day will go a long way.

Uniform

UNIFORM

a royal blue sweatshirt with the school badge, a blue polo shirt, grey school trousers or skirt and sensible black footwear (shoes or all black trainers).

In the summer children may wear a light blue gingham dress and grey school shorts.

PE Kit

A plain white T-shirt, black shorts (or black leggings/ jogging bottoms) and school sweatshirt for PE. Children wear their PE kit to school on their PE day.

Children are NOT allowed to wear ANY jewellery.
Wearing an Elastoplast to cover jewellery is not an option.
No dyed hair, tramline hair cuts or extreme hair styles
Please ensure that all items of clothing are labelled with your child's name on.

Any other business...

- Please let us know if someone different is collecting your child!
- Changes to school meal service Free Meals
- Book bags can be purchased for £4.50 and will be given out in September.

Medical

- Any sickness, diarrhoea, must be followed by at least 48 hours absence.
- Head lice are common! Please check regularly and treat as recommended.
- Any absence requires a telephone call to the school office by 9:15am
